**PRELIMINARY FALL 2002 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

This report summarizes preliminary fall term 2002 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments for Illinois colleges and universities, and 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollment for fiscal year 2001. Final fall term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall term enrollments provide a “snapshot” of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day of the fall term. Unduplicated headcount enrollment illustrates the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

Preliminary Fall 2002 Enrollments

Fall 2002 preliminary headcount enrollments at 187 institutions total 785,631 representing an increase of 4.4 percent from fall 2001. A table with headcount and FTE enrollment for each Illinois college and university for fall terms 2001 and 2002 is attached. The headcount enrollment by sector for the last six fall terms is shown below.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment increase of 5,043 (2.6 percent) between fall 2001 and 2002 while public community colleges reported a headcount increase of 15,731 (4.6 percent). Independent institutions reported a headcount increase of 12,104 (5.5 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments. The category “Independent Not-For-Profit Institutions” includes those not-for-profit institutions offering liberal arts curricula or a variety of courses of study along with professional, theological, fine arts, and technical institutions. Enrollments in degree-granting proprietary institutions are reported in the second category. In the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment

increase of 6,054 (3.2 percent), while the proprietary institutions headcount increased by 6,050 (22.4 percent).

Fall 2002 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollments among all Illinois institutions total 550,774, an increase of 25,152 (4.8 percent) over fall 2001. Undergraduate FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing the number of undergraduate credit hours by 15. The number of graduate credit hours is divided by 12. The FTE enrollment by sector for the last six fall terms is shown below.

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment increase of 4,702 (2.8 percent), while community colleges reported an increase of 10,476 (5.7 percent). Independent institutions reported a net increase of 9,974 (5.6 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported an increase of 5,198 (3.3 percent) in FTE enrollments, while proprietary institutions reported an increase of 4,776 (24.3 percent).

The relatively significant growth in both headcount and FTE enrollment reported across all sectors in fall term 2002 is in part a reflection of the current economic downturn. Research has shown that more individuals tend to enroll in higher education during such recessionary periods to gain new credentials or upgrade their knowledge and skills in order to be more competitive in the labor market.

Ratio of FTE Enrollment to Headcount

The ratio of FTE enrollment to headcount enrollment is a measure of the proportion of students that are enrolled full-time. As illustrated in the table below, this ratio increased slightly in fall 2002 for all three sectors with the greatest change seen in the community colleges (from 53.9 to 54.5 percent). This slight increase in the proportion of students enrolled full-time in fall 2002 versus fall 2001 is again a reflection of the current economic downturn.

Total Headcount Enrollments – 12 Months

Another way to examine enrollment trends is to count the total number of people who take courses over an entire year. The 12-month unduplicated headcount shows all students enrolled for credit. In the 2000-01 academic year, the most recent year for which information is available, total enrollment in Illinois colleges and universities was 1,171,276. A breakdown shows there were 231,206 students taking courses at public universities; 273,579 at independent institutions; and 666,491 at community colleges.

The following table illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for fiscal years 1997 through 2001. Data reported do not count the same person twice if they attended in both the fall and spring terms. In fiscal year 2001, Illinois colleges and universities served 1,171,276 students, a 1.2 percent increase from the number served in 2000.

In comparison to the fall 2000 enrollment, there were an additional 428,327 individuals across all sectors who attended either during the spring 2001 or summer 2001 terms. Students enrolled at community colleges accounted for more than three-fourths of this total incremental difference (328,100).

There are also a significant number of Illinois community college students enrolled in non-credit courses. For 2000-01, Illinois community colleges had an unduplicated non-credit headcount of 313,094 students, according to data collected by the Illinois Community College Board. When combined with the credit courses the total community college system enrollment is over 1 million students. Data on non-credit course enrollments are not available for public universities and independent institutions.
